We are still continuing to badger National Highways (previously Highways England) about the A1 layby and the state of the footpath alongside the A1, not to mention the dangerous entrance/exit from the A1 into Thornhaugh. Wansford Parish Council have also been doing the same so we will be working together to try and get changes made.

## 7. Website

#### 8. Tree Works

As we are heading into the pruning and garden tidying season ready for Spring and Summer (can't wait!) please remember that Thornhaugh is in a conservation area and therefore any tree pruning or felling, including pollarding/re-pollarding, requires a Notice from Peterborough City Council if the tree is big enough - stem diameter of 75mm, at 1.5m above ground level. A simple call or message to the Tree Officer (Stephen Chesney-Beale) will help you understand what's required. Happy gardening.

## 9. Village Sign

The Village Sign is starting to look a little "tired". We have commissioned a renovation to take place during Spring this year.

## 10. Village Green (at Home Farm)

Martin Witherington has been doing a lot of work to establish a Village Green at the Home Farm (Old Leicester Road) end of the village. Martin has put in a lot of hours to try and make this happen and the registration of the green is currently with Peterborough City Council Planning Department for formal inclusion on the register. Thanks to Martin and others who have supported him. A great initiative for the residents at that end of our lovely village.
