1. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

There were apologies for absence from John Holdich and Diane Lamb (Ward Councillors).

2. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

Martin Withering declared an interest in Home Farm Matters.

3. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The Members of the Public raised the following issues:-

- Lack of general maintenance work undertaken in the village, including grass cutting, gulley cleaning, tidying up around street light and road signs by the Fix-It Team (the Clerk will obtain a list of what the Fix-It Team should be undertaking)
- Blocked gulley on A47. Mr P Tebb, PCC had already been contacted about this by and had agreed to inspect it (the Clerk will request that it is monitored and cleaned out on a regular basis)
- **MINUTES** of the Sixth Meeting of the 2011/2012 Parish Council held on Tuesday 13th March 2012 were reviewed, approved and signed by the Chairman.

5. MATTERS ARISING

i) Home Farm Matters

Martin Witherington stated that he was submitting a Planning Application for the re-building of his late mother's cottage at Home Farm and the Parish Council will be sent details by the Planning Department later on in the year.

ii) Report on Royal Diamond Jubilee Celebrations

Brian Watts report that despite the inclement weather conditions, the day had been very successful and thanks were expressed to everyone who contributed. It was noted that £350 had been raised for the Downs' Syndrome Association of Peterborough. It was agreed to put an article and photographs onto the Website.

iii) Speeding in the Village

Ms C George, Road Safety Officer had confirmed that members from the road safety team had undertaken random speed surveys in Thornhaugh at different times of the day w/c 2nd July 2012. Vehicle speeds were monitored in the 30 mph zone as they entered and exited the village. On each occasion only a few vehicles speeds were recorded, for example during one morning between 8.30 am and 9.00 am only five vehicles were recorded and the speed of vehicles ranged from 22 mph to the highest speed recorded of 37 mph. Ms George had also raised the question with Highways again regarding a "SLOW" marking and moving the national speed limit sign to behind the bend and is currently awaiting a response from the Network Manager. It was agreed to request a decision from the Network Manager as a matter of urgency and to request that Ms George attends the next Parish Council Meeting. It was noted that the grass verge from 10 Russell Hill to the speed limit sign is not close cut and motorists might think they are out of the village and start accelerating too soon. William Rogers agreed to contact Mr C Jackson to discuss this. Liam Higgins stated he wish to record his objection to the proposed 20 mph due to the number of signs already in the village.

iv) Double White Lines on A47

It was noted that although funding has been agreed, there has been a delay in the painting of Double White Lines on the A47 due to awaiting permission from the Department of Transport.

A discussion took place regarding the supply and erection of a Village Sign. One of the members of the public had undertaken some research and had brought along a leaflet from a local wood-carver. It was agreed Brian Watts would meet with the local wood-carver to discuss possible design and cost. It was agreed the design could possibly include William Russell, William Russell's Coat-of-Arms and St Andrew's Church. It was noted that the Parish Council would not fund the cost of a Village Sign but would look at applying for grants for the cost.

10. FOOTPATHS AROUND COOKS HOLE

Brian Watts reported that Footpath Number 3 is open but Footpath No 4 is not in operation yet and incorrect signage is currently displayed. He will put a map showing the current route of Footpath No 4 onto the Village Noticeboard and request that he is informed when Footpath No 4 is open.

It was noted that there had been bell ringing practice at St Andrew's Church until 9.00 pm on 16th July 2012. This issue will be put on the Agenda for the next meeting.
